Modelling trauma of pedestrians and rear seated occupants to compute vehicle speed for court cases, develop an understanding of internal organ injuries and to assist in future vehicle design. Research project with West Midlands Police led by Dr Christophe Bastien, Associate Professor. Engineering Simulations Group Leader, Coventry University
